

Licence to publish in *Journal of Social Intervention: Theory and Practice*

The undersigned,

Name(s) of the Author(s):
referred to hereinafter as: “the Author”

grants to

Hanze University of Applied Sciences, located in Groningen,
referred to hereinafter as: “the Publisher”

the following licence.

Whereas

This agreement concerns the publication of academic works and reflects the balance between the rights of the Author and those of the Publisher in accordance with the following principles:
the Author and the Publisher are of the opinion that it is in the general interest to provide maximum access to academic works without any adverse effects on quality or academic freedom, especially where such works have been publicly funded;
the Publisher wishes to be compensated financially for the value it adds in the publication of academic works;
in the so-called subscription model, a balance is required between the provision of maximum access to academic works and the financial compensation involved in the publication thereof;

Article 1: Definitions

The following is a list of key terms and their definitions:

- **Acceptance:** the Publisher’s informing of the Author of its willingness to publish the Author’s works;
- **Article:** the published version of the Author’s work, entitled “...“;
- **Publication:** the journal or comparable periodic publication, in print or digital form, for which the Article is intended.

Article 2: Licence

1. On Acceptance, the Author grants the Publisher a general, exclusive licence for the term of the copyright to exercise certain entitlements pertaining to the copyright concerning the Article, which have a commercial purpose.
2. The exclusive licence referred to in the previous subclause includes the right of the Publisher to:
 - reproduce or publish the Article fully or partially in print and/or digital form (or have a third party do so), whether or not in combination with the works of third parties, for example by means of online provision via internet or any other network or as part of a database, online or offline, put at the disposal of third parties;
 - translate (or have a third party translate) the Article, and reproduce or publish it in translation (or have a third party do so);

- edit the Article (or have a third party edit it), and reproduce or publish it in edited form (or have a third party do so), to the extent such is required in order to publish the Author's work;
 - save the Article (or have a third party do so), whether or not in translation, or in edited, excerpted or summary form, either fully or partially, as a digital data file, such that the Article is made accessible to third parties;
 - include (or have a third party include) the Article, either fully or partially, in translated or edited form in any anthology or other work of compilation;
 - rent out or lend the Article to any third party, without prejudice to statutory limitations;
 - have any third party reproduce the Article reprographically, without prejudice to statutory limitations;
3. The Publisher will take responsibility for attribution and source referencing.

Article 3: Author's Rights

1. The following rights are reserved to the Author, among others:

- *Use for educational and research purposes*
The right to reproduce or publish the Article, whether or not digitally (reprographically or electronically), and whether or not as part of a reader, a compilation, or for the purposes of education or research within the institution at which the Author is employed, on condition that no direct or indirect economic or commercial benefit is pursued in doing so;
- *Accessibility*
The right to grant the institution at which the Author is employed or an institution with which the Author is affiliated permission to include the Article on its own closed network immediately following publication of the Article; and the right to grant the institution at which the Author is employed permission to store the Article immediately following publication (unless the Author and the Publisher have agreed to a brief embargo period of up to 6 (six) months) in a repository of this institution which is freely accessible to the public, or in a decentralised digital repository, on condition that access to this storage location is not provided on a commercial basis, and that the Author includes a hyperlink to the Publisher's website in the Article;
- *Preservation on the part of the institution*
The right to grant permission to the institution at which the Author is employed or any institution with which the Author is affiliated to reproduce the Article for the purpose of protecting the Article from deterioration or, if the technology with which the Article may be made accessible falls into disuse, in order to maintain the work's usability for education and research;
- *Future reuse*
The right to include the Article in its entirety or in part in a dissertation, a compilation or in another work, on condition that no direct or indirect economic or commercial advantage is pursued in doing so. Where the Article is to be reused commercially, the Author will request the permission of the Publisher.
- *Private use*
The right to present the Article at any meeting (for example, a conference) or to issue copies of the Publication to the participants of such a meeting, on condition that no direct or indirect economic or commercial advantage is pursued in doing so;
- *Third-party use*
The right to allow the institution at which the Author is employed or any institution with which the Author is affiliated to grant end users permission to reproduce or publish the Article or to edit the Article and to reuse this

2. For any type of use or reuse of the Article as referred to in the foregoing, the Author or the Publisher will undertake at all times to provide a comprehensive reference of sources (including at minimum the name(s) of the Author(s), the title and edition of the Publication and the name of the Publisher), unless this proves impossible.

Article 4: Personality rights

The Author's personality rights in respect of the Article are not infringed by this agreement. More specifically, the Author is entitled to be referred to as the Author of the Article, and he is entitled to resist the mutilation and impairment of his Article.

Article 5: Indemnity

1. The Author guarantees the Publisher that he possesses the entire copyright to the Article and that he is not infringing any rights of third parties through his Article. The Author will indemnify the Publisher against all third party claims resulting from the Article's Publication. This indemnity will also apply to any photographs, drawings or other illustrations provided by the Author with his Article, unless the copyright to the illustrations is expressly reserved by the Author on submission of his Article.
2. The Author authorises the Publisher to take legal action in collaboration with the Author against any copyright infringement. The parties undertake to provide each other with every assistance desired and to provide any information required immediately on request.

Article 6: Obligation to publish

The Publisher undertakes to proceed to publish the Author's work within a reasonable period following Acceptance.

Article 7: Author's copies

The Author is entitled to two review copies of the edition of the Publication in which his Article is included. In case of an Edition published in digital form only, the Author is entitled to a copy, or has a right to access the Edition in question, for the purpose of being able to make a copy for personal use. The Author may not put these review copies or the copies made from the digital copy into circulation, sell them or have a third party sell them.

Article 8: Legal relationship

1. The Publisher is entitled to transfer its exploitation rights in respect of the Article to a third party, provided such third party meets the obligations entered into by the Publisher towards the Author.
2. Should the Author be able to demonstrate that any use of his Article by the Publisher pursuant to this exclusive licence is detrimental to the Author's moral interests, he may request the Publisher to cease making such use. The Publisher will comply with this request unless such cannot be reasonably expected of it in view of the Article's scientific or historical value.
3. Termination of the agreement will not affect any previously legally valid rights granted by the Publisher to third parties.

Article 9: Several Authors

Where there are several authors, the Author has the permission of every author to enter into this agreement on his/her behalf.

Article 10: Applicable law

This agreement is governed by the law of the country in which the Author resides. Disputes will be submitted to the competent court of the aforementioned country according to the normal rules concerning jurisdiction.

Article 11: Concluding provision

The agreement will take effect on the day of Acceptance.
